U of T's commitment to equity, diversity, and inclusion made me realize this was an environment I could thrive in as a XXX Woman because pieces of myself would no longer have to take a back seat in certain spaces. By surrounding myself with like-minded individuals with shared lived experiences, I've been able to advocate for marginalized groups and works towards systemic change. Receiving this award validates my experiences as a double minority and motivates me to become the Physician Leader and Advocate my community needs.

Growing up, I was instilled with the values of hard work. Ever since my parents stepped foot in this country, they never knew a life outside of work, initially each working two jobs to build a life for our family of five. Education was always a privilege that my parents emphasized, since it would open doors for me to pursue my passions.

I don't come from a family of healthcare professionals. Rather I am an outsider to medicine, a second generation immigrant, first-generation University grad. My current financial situation presents a barrier for me, which makes it difficult to finance my studies on my own. Receiving this award has relieved a lot of that financial burden and helped me focus on my medical education and passions - advocating for marginalized groups and making an impact in my community, be it through conducting research within immigrant populations, advocating for anti-black racism in academic hospitals, or through co-founding a two-tiered longitudinal mentorship program for equity deserving learners.

Medicine is so versatile; I hope to make a difference at the individual, community and international level. We cannot forget about those who lack access or need our support, but we must also invest in our communities, whether that is through building housing, hospitals or places of gatherings. Thank you again for supporting my dreams of becoming a Physician Leader and Advocate.






Understanding your Endowment Report
